MTCF Partners with Thiensville Village Park Relmagined for Community Pickleball Courts and Splash Pad

Thiensville Village Park lies in the heart of Meguon and Thiensville along a beautiful stretch of the Milwaukee River and sees over 100,000 visitors a year. In addition to the many ball fields, play grounds, walking trails and covered pavilion, this 16.3 acre park also plays host to a variety of wonderful events, including Fun Before the Fourth, the Best Dam Blues Festival, and the local Farmer's Market.

In 2017, the Thiensville Village Board approved a capital project called "Village Park Relmagined" with a bold and exciting vision to elevate the park to new heights. With this, a new committee was formed to help oversee the fundraising for the park's improvements. This new Thiensville Village Park ReImagined Committee (VPRI) has already realized significant improvements, including the installation of a new entryway arch, upgraded restrooms, new playground equipment, and the addition of the Port Washington State Bank (PWSB) River Stage. Now, the Committee has their sights set on realizing the next phase: the addition of a splash pad and four new pickleball courts!

With monies received from a Land Water Conservation Fund grant and those committed by the Village of Thiensville, the pickleball court project needs just \$83,000 to close the gap. Similarly, VPRI has already raised an impressive \$225,000 to date towards the splash pad (including a \$10,000 grant awarded from MTCF), resulting in a need for \$125,000 to begin construction.

The Mequon-Thiensville Community Foundation is excited to partner with the Village of Thiensville and VPRI to help close the gap and bring these additions to fruition! With your help, these projects can commence this year! Make your donations to MTCF and specify splash pad, Pickleball or VPRI (donation will be used wherever most needed for the park).



The splash pad will be built immediately adjacent to the playground on an existing greenspace, bringing safe water play for all to enjoy. The splash pad's design makes it fully accessible to one and all and extends water play earlier and later in the season than the community pool.

The two existing tennis courts at Village Park need resurfacing. As part of this work, the Village approved the creation of two dedicated pickleball courts from one of the tennis courts while adding pickleball court lines on the remaining tennis court, with two portable pickleball nets available. Ultimately, this will provide four pickleball courts at the park.



MTCF Grants \$15K to Meguon Police Department for New K-9 Officer



Thanks to MTCF's \$15,000 grant this year, the Mequon Police Department will be bringing in a new K9 Officer this fall to replace K9 Officer Iron, who retired in March. The police department currently has K9 Officer Djuke, a male 4 ¹/₂ year old German Shepherd, who has been with the police department since fall of 2020. K9 Officer Djuke is trained and certified in tracking, narcotics detection, handler protection, apprehension, and building/area searches.

The new K9, once trained, will become K9 Officer Djuke's new partner. According to Police Chief Patrick Pryor, having an experienced K-9 on the road while training a new K9 allows for the transfer of knowledge and skills and ensures the continued success of the program. Moreover, having a second K9 enhances the safety and security to the community, particularly during the busy 4 p.m. - midnight shift.

"Our mission is to enhance the quality of life in Meguon and Thiensville and this is just one of many ways that we do that," said MTCF Director and Past President Jim Button, "We know the value a K9 brings to the community, including diffusing a situation that might otherwise turn bad, suspect apprehension, drug interdiction, finding a missing person, and more. It's an extremely important program within our community and we're proud to be a part of it."

MTCF was instrumental in raising funds for K9 Officer Djuke in 2019 and the extra funds from that effort were held in MTCF's restricted funds for the K9 program. This allowed MTCF to make this grant to cover costs for the purchase of the new dog, the training, and its handler's equipment and services.

\$10,000 Grant to MTLL for Fencing at Village Park field in Thiensville



The Mequon-Thiensville Little League (MTLL) held its annual "Swing for the Fences" fundraiser at Fox Town Annex on April 22, 2023. MTCF was there to proudly announce its \$10,000 grant to fully fund one of the two temporary fences needed at the Thiensville Village Park.

MTLL uses two of the three fields at the park for their games and tournaments. These fields have seasonal fencing that needs to be replaced every few years, and the organization has been looking to raise funds for something more permanent. "We are so appreciative of the \$10,000 grant from the Mequon-Thiensville Community Foundation," says Jennifer Wirth, MTLL President, "as this will fully fund one of the two new outfield fences." During the event, Lori Lorenz, MTCF President, stated, "Youth baseball and softball are an integral part of recreation in our community. and adding this fencing will benefit this experience for our youth, families, and fans. It fits perfectly within our mission of enhancing the guality of life in Meguon and Thiensville."

A portion of the additional funds raised at the event will help support the second fence initiative, and project-based donations like this are always welcome to close the gap.

MTCF Grants \$8,340 for Two New eBikes for Village of Thiensville

MTCF granted \$8,340 for the purchase of two ebikes to enhance the police department's bike patrol capabilities. Police Chief Curt Kleppin noted that they will foster officer-citizen communication, making interactions more accessible and community-oriented.

The ebikes will facilitate longer patrol durations, enable officers to navigate through crowds and reach places inaccessible to vehicles, expanding their patrol range. Additionally, the bikes will improve response times during special events, providing efficient service to the community.

The grant from MTCF and \$1,000 from the MT Optimist Club covered the bikes, helmets and training for at least four officers.

Summer Evening Chef's Table & Taste of Mequon **Yields \$165k for MT Trails Foundation** ONLY \$200,000 NEEDED TO FUND THE \$1.5 MILLION TRAIL!

The Mequon-Thiensville Community Foundation partnered with the MT-Trails Foundation to host its inaugural Summer Evening Chef's Table fundraiser at the Gathering on the Green grounds under the tents at Rotary Park on July 13. In total, this event alone raised \$163,000 towards funding their first project, a bike/pedestrian paved off-road path connecting Highland Road to the Ozaukee Interurban Trail.

Featuring 10 elite chefs from a variety of top-notch restaurants and local venues, attendees savored exquisite five-course meals with unique beverage pairings in a picturesque outdoor setting. Contributing to the festive atmosphere, the local band "Pretty When She's Angry" provided lively entertainment.

On September 9, MTCF sponsored a tent for the MT Trails Foundation at the City of Meguon's Taste of Mequon. There was much excitement about this project, with \$1,500 raised to support the MT Trails Foundation during the event.

As of September 2023, MTCF has helped raise \$1,300,000 towards the Highland Road Bike/Pedestrian Path, leaving just \$200,000 to fund this \$1.5 million project.

Overall, the event raised \$66,000 for our community, including \$29,000 through a paddle raise to benefit Villa Grove Park in Meguon. Andrew identified the need for a second boat launch at Villa Grove Park as a top interest. His family often used the Villa Grove boat launch while his children were growing up and they knew firsthand the congestion and backups resulting from having a single boat launch and pier to the Milwaukee River. Andrew would love to see more people benefit from greater access to the water and experience the joy the river can provide.

While working with the city of Mequon, it was discovered that improvements to Villa Grove
